- Bell motioned to send a policy recommendation to ACCPD Chief Saulters. The policy recommendation is as follows: 1. Local law enforcement should encourage public engagement and collaboration including the use of community advisory boards, when developing a policy for the use of new technology. New technology meaning automatic license plate readers (ALPR), facial recognition, artificial intelligence (AI), and real-time crime center integration of all surveillance 2. Law enforcement agencies should include an evaluation of the assessment process to gauge the effectiveness of any new technology, soliciting input from all levels of the agency, from line officer to leadership, as well as assessment from members of the community. O'Neil seconded. Unanimously accepted.
- O'Neil motioned to accept ride-along, tour of UGA police, and shadowing 911 dispatch as training hours. Mallory seconded. Unanimously accepted.
