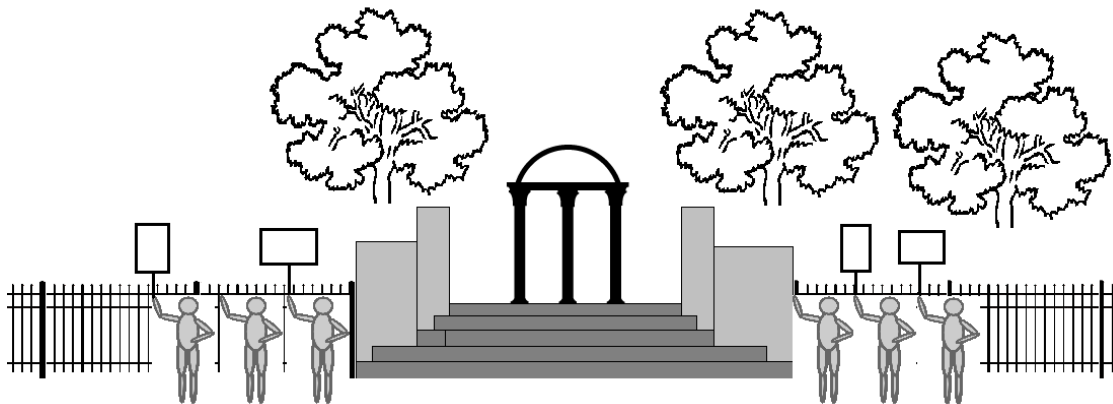
The Arch is on University of Georgia property, and serves as both the symbolic gateway to UGA and the true “front door” to campus for employees, students, and visitors entering UGA from downtown Athens. The Arch therefore serves several roles, and its importance to UGA and the people of our community must be considered when protests are planned in the area of the Arch.

The University of Georgia Police Department recognizes the vital role of law enforcement in facilitating the constitutionally guaranteed rights of assembly and protest in Athens. Therefore, in support of individuals choosing to exercise these rights in the area of the Arch, regulations have been developed regarding the conduct of protests, and must be followed by individuals and groups. These rules have been created in a sincere effort to balance the needs and interests of UGA personnel and students, individuals doing business with UGA, visitors, the Athens community, and protestors.

If you are planning a protest in the vicinity of the Arch, please ensure each member of your group is aware of the following rules.

- Protestors may not:
- Block the Arch
 - Stand on the steps of the Arch
 - Stand in or occupy plant or flower beds
 - Have pets not on a leash and/or not under control
 - Affix protest items (signs, banners, fliers) to permanent structures
 - Leave behind waste materials or garbage, except in appropriate containers designed for this use
- All of these requirements are applicable 24 hours a day***

The diagram below illustrates a basic example of what is expected for the area.
