





Trails

Opened the next phase of the North Oconee River Greenway Trail System through the historic Oconee Hill Cemetery. This recently completed section includes a concrete multi-use trail generally following the banks of the North Oconee River approximately 0.68 miles connecting existing greenway trails on the east side of the North Oconee River.

Historic Lyndon House

Introduced Ware-Lyndon Historic House Museum's new exhibit including a short film providing insight into enslaved families who lived on the property and their descendants, charting a musical journey that suits the rich musical history of Athens. "Resilient Civic and Musical Life: Ware-Lyndon House Enslaved and Descendant Stories" exhibition and the Athens African American Heritage Pathway funded through an AARP Community Challenge Grant.





Firefly Bridge



Dedicated the newly completed 525-foot long Firefly Bridge over Trail Creek and “rebuilding” the iconic R.E.M.. Murmur Trestle originally built in 1883.

Arts Summit

Presented the two-day Arts Summit 2022 at the Morton Theatre. The Summit advocates, educates, and elevates local artists and creatives through career development and professional practices. This summit was free and open to the public and included panels, lectures, and sessions designed to educate and encourage professional advancement in the creative arts field. The event was perfect for the working artist, from visual to performing and any other creative activities, in any stage of their career.

- Hosted the annual “Deck the Hollow” holiday event at Bear Hollow Zoo. Over the course of five nights, more than 1,500 people attended and enjoyed seeing the zoo decorated in holiday lights and displays.
- Hosted the Bear’s Birthday Party at Bear Hollow Zoo with approximately 300 participants in attendance.
- Presented the East Athens Educational Dance Center’s annual production at the Morton Theatre. School shows took place on Thursday, February 23 with seven local schools in attendance. Over the course of three days, 1000+ individuals enjoyed the performances.

Highlights



- Celebrated the 50th anniversary of Sandy Creek Nature Center. A variety of events took place including art show, book signings, the donation of fifty books to the public library, time capsule, volunteer work day, and more. A special brochure was created providing fifty ways that individuals could celebrate the golden anniversary of the center.
- Presented four performances of the musical production, “Jekyll & Hyde the Musical” on the Morton Theatre stage in downtown Athens. The main-stage production was Athens Creative Theatre’s largest project of the calendar year and featured a cast of 35, 1-piece orchestra, and a crew of more than 13 production team members and support staff.



- Introduced “Broadway Outings,” focusing on providing theatrical experiences for teens. Teens participated on field trips to the Classic Center to see touring Broadway productions such as “Chicago” and “Legally Blonde.” The experience included a pre-performance group activity, dinner, and a take-home study guide prepared by Athens Creative Theatre staff.
- Coordinated the “Star Spangled Classic” at the Athens Ben Epps Airport. Department staff organized the community’s official Independence Day celebration involving six other government departments. The evening featured a 25-minute fireworks display with the public socially distancing in cars to enjoy the event.
- Operated the ACCGov Warming Center over the Christmas 2022 weekend. The Lay Park Community Center was open to a maximum of 120 homeless individuals and those who did not have power or heat in their homes. Leisure Services staff worked with the American Red Cross and Athens-Clarke County Fire and Emergency Services to establish and helped staff it with department employees.

Looking Ahead



- The Leisure Services Department Master Plan development will begin in fiscal year 2024.
- The new Sandy Creek Park playground will open in spring and feature Athens-Clarke County's first fully inclusive play equipment.
- Carr's Creek Greenway Expansion will add $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile of paved trail and directly connect with the bike trails on Barnett Shoals Road, and should open Spring 2024.
- The revamped Memorial Park Dog Park is expected to open in Fall 2023. It will be ADA accessible and address the previous erosion issues.
- Four pieces of public art will be installed including two along the Greenway and two more along the Firefly Trail.
- Construction begins on a new pool at Bishop Park.
- Hot Air Balloon Festival, Saturday, September 30, at Sandy Creek Park.
